Phil's Jazz Chat

There were many outstanding trumpeters in the early years of jazz. Everybody knows Louis Armstrong and probably Leon "Bix" Beiderbecke. However, I'd like to draw your attention to some others who you might enjoy listening to. I'll refer to them all as "trumpeters" even if they played the cornet.

For the uninitiated, the cornet is an instrument very similar to the trumpet but has a more conical bore and therefore has a mellower, more rounded sound. It is prominent in brass bands and military bands and was the preferred instrument of early jazz trumpeters.

Henry "Red" Allen was an outstanding trumpeter who had a long career. Born in New Orleans and originally influenced by Louis Armstrong, he developed his own style. Ernest "Red" Nicholls was a cornetist more in the Bix Beiderbecke mold. He made a lot of very interestingly arranged recordings in 1920s with his band the "Five Pennies" His life was depicted in the movie "The Five Pennies" starring Danny Kaye as Red. Although a rather "Hollywoodised" film, it does contain some lovely scenes of famous musicians.

Joseph "Wingy" Manone was also from New Orleans and was dubbed "Wingy" because he lost an arm in a streetcar accident. He was a fine trumpeter and was responsible for introducing the riff in his recording of "Tar Paper Stomp" which later became the basis of Glenn Miller's famous song "In the Mood". Rex Stewart was a prominent member of the Duke Ellington Band in the 1930s and made a specialty of interesting sound effects produced with the use of mutes. He was significant in Australia as a special guest of the second Australian Jazz Convention.

Francis "Muggsy" Spanier was also famous for his virtuosic use of the plunger mute. This is a technique whereby the player holds a toilet plunger, water glass, or similar in front of the bell of the instrument and moves it around to vary the sound. A classic recording of Muggsy's is "The Great Sixteen" by his "Ragtime Band". William "Wild Bill" Davison was a lyrical, hot player with a unique style. He was a favourite of Eddie Condon.

There are many other outstanding traditional jazz trumpeters but these are a few who are worth listening to if you never heard of them.

The band was put together from musicians from various jazz bands at the time. The concept was that the band would present and play mainly authentic material of the free flowing, pulsating, revivalist jazz style heard in numerous venues of that famous city, New Orleans. Heritage has had almost the same line-up since the start. It's fun and the music is swinging, fresh and joyous!



MARCH 19 BECHET LEGACY BAND

Passion ... perfection ... genius ... are words used to describe New Orleans legend Sidney Bechet. Phil Hatton, featured artist at more than 50 jazz festivals in the USA, has assembled a superb band featuring himself and Steve Searle on reeds, Kim Anning on guitar, Mal Mah (Bass) and Dave Gryl (Drums), to play music composed and inspired by Bechet. If you're a Bechet fan or simply a fan of New Orleans jazz, and the two reed sound, you won't want to miss this!



MARCH 26 THAT'S JAZZ


