Phil's Jazz Chat

Traditional jazz, the music that we love, was born mainly in New Orleans at the start of the Twentieth Century. But what is traditional jazz? What are its characteristics and what enables us to say that something we hear is traditional or not. Obviously, to some extent this is subjective and in the ear of the beholder. The Traditional Jazz Educator's Network in a "Traditional Jazz Style Guide" written by Dave Robinson attempts to define and categorise traditional jazz.

Robinson states that there are four basic ingredients as follows:

- 1. Wind instruments playing polyphonically;
- 2. Easily discernible chord patterns;
- 3. 2/4 or 4/4 meter;
- 4. Instrumentation of a front line consisting of trumpet, clarinet, trombone and perhaps various saxophones and a rhythm section consisting of one or all of piano, banjo or guitar, tuba, string bass or bass sax and drums or washboard

He then proceeds to list eleven different styles of traditional jazz under six separate sub categories:

- 1. New Orleans Styles
 - a) Brass band style-example Eureka Brass Band
 - b) Classic New Orleans Style example King Oliver's Creole jazz Band
 - c) New Orleans Revival style example Kid Ory -1944 to '61
- 2. Early Derivative Styles
 - a) Early Dixieland style example Original Dixieland Jazz Band - 1917 to '22
 - b) New York style example Biz Beiderbecke and his Gang 1927/28
- 3. Chicago Styles
 - a) Early Chicago style McKenzie and Condon's Chicagoans 1927
 - b) Chicago style Eddie Condon 1933 to '71
- 4. Chicago style Extensions
 - a) Swing style Bob Crosby's Bobcats 1937 to '45
 - b) Mainstream style Ruby Braff late '50s to '90s
- 5. San Francisco Style "West Coast" style Turk Murphy 1947 to '88
- 6. European Trad style Chris Barber Bands 1949 to 2003.

You can find Robinson's further explanations of the characteristics of these styles at http://prjc.org/tjen/styleguide.htm. You can also gain further understanding by listening to the examples given, which are all to be found on youtube. Robinsons states that labels "can be dangerous" and it should be born in mind that most bands are playing a mixture of the above mentioned styles or perhaps a variation thereof. I think we can say that many bands around the world are now trying to develop their own variations of traditional jazz style and in this way the music is still alive and developing. Every improvising musician brings their own experience and sensibility to what they play and, if it is to be an authentic expression, it has to be in some way personal to them and from the heart.

"The Stevedores Jazz Band" is a Seven piece Traditional Jazz Band. The band enjoys an excellent reputation as one of Perth's top Traditional Jazz Bands. The Stevedores was originally formed in 1992 by Bert Nicholls (Banjo) to play as the resident band at the Railway Hotel in Fremantle between 1992 and 1995. After Bert's passing in 1999 his wife, Lynn, took over the management of the band and filled the Banjo position.

The band plays an up-tempo style of 'Traditional Jazz' suitable for dancing and all types of social occasions. The band has an extensive list of previous engagements from weddings in the country through to wineries and private parties in WA

including Corporate Functions aboard 'The Paddle Steamer Decoy'. The band has recorded two CDs both of which are available by emailing: stevedoresjazzband@westnet.com.au.

At the beginning of 2021 Len Bagnall, our cornet player, decided he would retire from Bandwork. I would like to acknowledge the huge contribution Len Bagnall has made as Musical Director of the Stevedores over the 27 years. He has been a great friend and support to me. Since then we have used the excellent talents of Steve Searle and Robbie Bresland on trumpet. Both have been a great asset to the band.
