
Also farewell to Gerry Crowden, he bid us all goodbye last week after a long sickness. Sincere condolences to his family on behalf of the jazz club.

VALE BARRY BRUCE



We lost one of the central figures of Perth Jazz recently with the death of Barry Bruce, aged 84. The loss of Barry is going to be deeply felt by the Perth jazz community and indeed the Australian jazz community. Barry has been an important figure in our jazz scene, particularly traditional jazz, for most of his life and remained highly active until diagnosed with a brain tumor six months before he died. He played in many Perth bands, led his own bands, taught many students both privately in his home studio and at the West Australian Academy of Performing Arts and mentored many musicians. He was known throughout the Australian traditional jazz community as one of the best in the country in his style and was welcomed as a sit in by all when he visited the eastern states

He was always a powerful presence, both through his playing and his passion for the music, and was the heart of any band he played in. Stylistically his playing was rooted in the glory days of jazz, ranging from the Harlem stride typified by Fats Waller to the elegant early bebop styles typified by players such as Red Garland and Hank Jones. His greatest love and influence lay right in the middle of that spectrum and that was Teddy Wilson. Wilson was his first love musically and remained his deepest musical love to the end. He also loved Eddie Condon's pianist, Gene Schroeder, who exhibited many of the same stylistic characteristics but applied them in a Dixieland context.

Teddy Wilson's style was all about exquisite time, swing and harmonic beauty and so was Barry's. Playing with Barry was like falling into a warm, cozy featherbed of time, swing and harmony that enabled you to play your best. However, all the musicians know that Barry's passion for the music meant that he wanted it to be right and he was not happy or satisfied unless it was.

On behalf of the Perth jazz community I would like to say thank you Barry. Your spirit will endure in the many musicians and listeners you have touched throughout your life in music. My deepest condolences to Barry's family.

The concept was that the band would present and play mainly authentic material of the free flowing, pulsating, revivalist jazz style heard in numerous venues of that famous city, New Orleans. Heritage has had almost the same line-up since the start. It's fun and the music is swinging, fresh and joyous!

For December, we have **Alan Gresty** from the **UK** joining us on trumpet. Alan has played with British jazz greats like **Chris Barber**, **Acker Bilk** and **Monty Sunshine**. We're looking forward to a real traditional jazz treat in December!



DECEMBER 20 POWERHOUSE JAZZ BAND

The popular Powerhouse Jazz Band was formed in Perth in early 1997 with the commitment to perform a variety of popular jazz styles, but playing mainly dixieland, swing and some latin. Jazz in Fremantle. Part 2

The Railway Hotel, a perspective by Roy Burton

The Australian Jazz Convention after Fremantle, in 1980, was at Forbes, in New South Wales. After experiencing the Fremantle convention the band decided to go to Forbes. Ross Donaldson had a friend who was a pilot and he arranged to hire a small plane to fly from Jandakot to Forbes, a trip of 14 hours. Most of the band flew in the plane, which resembled a mini car with wings, leaving Jandakot at midnight daylight for refuelling. We had to buzz the home of the man Christmas Night, so as to make Forest in who was in charge of refuelling and we watched him ride his motorbike to the airport as we circled to land on Boxing Day morning. After landing we all rushed behind the hangar to relieve ourselves. A further stop was made at Ceduna, before reaching Forbes. Ross Donaldson sat next to the pilot, Leon Cole and Dave Maxwell were in the back then Ann and I in the middle. Peter Barsden, who didn't like the idea of flying, travelled with his then girl friend Liz Shaw by train, along with Hans Hoëner. Peter and Liz adopted a stray cat at Forbes and brought it home with them in the return train. Although Peter didn't fancy flying he later went on to build and fly ultralight planes.

Mick Verdanovich was a Fremantle character and a great entrepreneur. Mick ran the National Hotel as manager licensee for a while and Corner House Jazz Band played weekly in the front bar, tucked in a back corner and overlapping onto the bar top. There was a local who fancied himself as a bass player. One night he was sitting in with the band, uninvited, playing standing on the bar top, when he disappeared with a bang. He and his bass had fallen off. He climbed back on the bar and continued playing. Mick was enovating the National using second-hand materials and the pub seemed to be in a constant state of upheaval. Mick played the alto sax and violin, both of them quite well, and often sat in with the band.

Mick Verdanovich later became licensee of a pub in the west end of Fremantle opposite the fire station. The pub had been run down and Mick used his promotional skills by organising theme days, 1st August was the horses birthday when he would have a jazz band and horses in the bar. St Patrick's Day was another large scale event, dyed green hair, a coffin on the bar and of course a jazz band.

The Saturday afternoon jazz session at the Railway Hotel continued to thrive over the years. There were always cars parked right up and down the centre median strip in Tydeman Road on Saturdays. At some point the Railway was inspected by Liquor Squad officers, who said that it was overcrowded and that either the pub had to be extended, or there would be a limit to the people attending, with the need for security to count them in and out. Doug decided to extend the pub, by filling in a courtyard area that had a beautiful jacaranda tree in the middle. Although he built the extension, he didn't actually knock the wall down that separated it from the main room. In this way he complied with the liquor requirements to increase the floor area, but didn't spoil the atmosphere of the pub. The construction work went on for weeks and people would be sitting on piles of bricks during the jazz session.

The crowd on Saturdays continued to grow and it wasn't long before Doug had to build another large room at the back. This effectively doubled the original area. Still, however, the room was separated from the main room of the pub by the original walls. It was like a large L shaped room surrounding the existing small room, where the band played, and where most of the people were.

In 1986 the band was invited to Sacramento, for the annual Dixieland Jubilee. We flew Air New Zealand and 20 supporters from the Railway came with us. At our Auckland stopover we played at a hotel in exchange for accommodation for the band and all its' supporters. The festival at Sacramento was huge and a great experience. Having started the WA Jazz Festival at York only three years before, there were many things that were done at Sacramento that we were able to bring to York, but on a smaller scale. The band was invited to Sacramento again in 1990.
